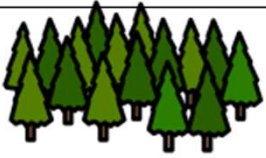

Rosliston Forest was planted from 1995. Before it was planted, it was farmland and fields. It was the start of the National Forest.



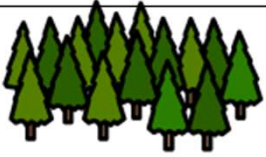
Locality: Awareness of local areas and their significance.
